

HOW TO APPLY

Applications should be submitted via the form on the website.

- Your name, contact information and postcode
- A concept proposal for the programme, which outlines your intended audience, ideas for potential partners and relationships you'd like to build, and why you think this would be relevant for Spike Island (up to 750 words)
- A current CV (maximum two pages)
- 8–15 images and/or up to 3 video files of recent work, with relevant captions (you may prefer to include a download link for a file-sharing platform such as Dropbox or Google Drive in your application)
- Your access document (if applicable)

Following submission of your application you will be prompted to complete an equal opportunities form which will be separated from your application and used for monitoring purposes only.

We will provide an information session in January 2026. This session will allow you to hear about the opportunity in more detail and to ask us questions. The session will be held on Zoom and recorded, so please sign up if you would like to be sent the recording.
